Moving and handling equipment and objects and handling hazardous substances and materials. Fire safety, implementing security measures and how to manage own stress

Unit 5 (8 weeks)


This unit focuses on:

Principles and practices relating to confidentiality at work and secure handling of information. How to access support for handling information and handling information in accordance with agreed ways of working

Unit 2 (8 weeks)

This unit focuses on:

The competence requirements in your role, reflecting on own work activities. Creating a personal development plan to develop own knowledge, skills and understanding. Understanding working relationships in care settings. working in ways that are agreed with your employer and working in partnership with others

Unit 4 (12 weeks)

This unit focuses on:

Person-centred approaches for care and support. How to establish consent when providing care and support. Encouraging active participation, supporting individual's right to make choices and their wellbeing. Understanding the importance of equality and inclusion and how to access information and support about diversity, equality and inclusion

Unit 6 (8 weeks)

This unit focuses on:

Understand the implications of duty of care and addressing dilemmas that may arise. Knowing how to respond to complaints. Principles of safeguarding adults, recognising signs of abuse and responding to suspected or alleged abuse. National and local context of safeguarding protection from abuse and approaches to reducing the likelihood of abuse Recognising and reporting unsafe practices and the principles for online safety
