30 months on-programme – This is when you will learn the skills, knowledge and behaviours which will then support you in the End-Point Assessment. You could partake in a combination of activities, such as classroom-based sessions, mentoring, shadowing, bespoke resources and off-site visits, in order to support your learning and development. You must also partake in 20% off-job training.

Gateway – After the 30 months teaching and learning, you and your training provider will review your learning journey and decide whether it is the right time for the on-programme assessment.

End-Point Assessment – This is when you will need to demonstrate you have learnt the required knowledge, skills and behaviours, through a knowledge based VIVA professional discussion and submission, review and technical questions relating to the work based project.
