

# CARPENTRY AND JOINERY

Level 2

Duration of the programme - 30 months

The broad purpose of this apprenticeship is working with building materials (most often wood) to create and install building components. This typically involves shaping and cutting materials, installing finished materials like partitions, doors, staircases, window frames, mouldings, timber floor coverings and erecting structural components such as floor joists and roofs. This occupation includes two different options and people will either work on a construction site as a Site Carpenter or in a workshop as an Architectural Joiner.

**30 months on-programme** – This is when you will learn the skills, knowledge and behaviours which will then support you in the End-Point Assessment. You could partake in a combination of activities, such as classroom-based sessions, mentoring, shadowing, bespoke resources and off-site visits, in order to support your learning and development. You must also partake in 20% off-job training.

**Gateway** – After the 30 months teaching and learning, you and your training provider will review your learning journey and decide whether it is the right time for the on-programme assessment.

**End-Point Assessment** – This is when you will need to demonstrate you have learnt the required knowledge, skills and behaviours, through a knowledge based VIVA professional discussion and submission, review and technical questions relating to the work based project.
